

Instruments - History

History of Instruments

Musical instruments are very old. We don't know exactly how old, but some instruments we found are from 67,000 years ago in Slovenia. They were simple flutes made from bone or wood. Other early music comes from drums and rattles. These instruments quickly spread around the world. People enjoyed the sounds and were happy to make music from them.

Since they first appeared, instruments have changed in many ways to make different sounds. Each country even has their own traditional way of making them. There are instruments that we hit, ones with strings, some that use our breath, and many more. Even though there are so many types, each one makes a sound that people like to hear.

Today, even your computer in an instrument. There are applications and programs that you can use to make your own songs. They can be used to make the musical sounds that come from instruments and some that can sing for you. 
